Research assistants are needed to work in the Grand River Watershed, which will serve as an outdoor laboratory to look at interactions between hydrological and ecological processes.

You are an ideal candidate if you:

- Are a student enrolled in SES, Geography, Biology or Civil Engineering
- Enjoy being outdoors and do not mind getting wet and dirty
- Are eager to learn about non-traditional data analysis techniques
- Have taken at least one water-related or soils-related course
- Have a full Ontario G driver's license

What the job will entail, depending on the position:

- Working from late April to mid-August 2019
- Juggling lab work and field work (which may, occasionally, mean long hours)
- Analyzing data (software-specific training will be provided)
- Preparing blog posts, conference presentations and potentially journal manuscripts

The experience you will gain includes:

- Basic field and/or instrumental skills
- Data-crunching skills, valued by environmental conservation employers and needed for grad school
